Our private lesson program is structured in 14-week semesters in the fall and spring. Lessons are held weekly on the Woodway Campus, and are 30 minutes in length. General times available are listed below. Our fall semester will conclude with special Christmas showcases. Our spring semester concludes with an official end-of-year recital.

SCHEDULING: Private lessons are scheduled according to teacher and student availability and lesson style preference. A sample schedule is below. Not all lesson time options are listed; not all teachers are available for all times shown.

NEW FOR 2023-2024:

VOICE LESSONS: Voice lessons will now be offered to NEW students age 12 and up. Returning students younger than 12 may continue.

PLACEMENT QUEUE: New students will be placed in a "Placement Queue" to await placement for lessons. Pay the \$10 registration fee to expedite the enrollment process after placement!

Our dance classes are divided into four basic levels: PINK, for dancers age 3-Kindergarten; BLACK, for dancers in elementary school; PURPLE for middle and high school; and TEAL, which is our most advanced level.

As our dancers continue in their studies, our dance faculty take great care in placing dancers in classes where they will have fun, be challenged, and succeed as they grow in the art of dance.

PINK LEVEL (Age 3-Kindergarten)

PINK level dance classes are pre-ballet classes designed for dancers beginning at age 3. Dancers in our pink classes wear pink leotards, pink tights, and pink ballet shoes.

BLACK LEVEL (COMBO CLASSES, Grades 1-4)

COMBO Level ballet classes are designed for dancers of all experience levels. Ballet Combos are named by general grade levels (i.e. Combo 1/2 Ballet & Tap will be geared toward 1st & 2nd Grade). Dancers should wear black leotards, pink tights, and black skirts.

PURPLE LEVEL (INTERMEDIATE CLASSES, Grade 5 +)

Intermediate class placement is by faculty recommendation and the classes are geared toward dancers in grade 5 and up. Dancers should wear purple leotards, pink tights, and black skirts.

TEAL LEVEL

TEAL level classes are considered Advanced and require faculty approval or invitation for enrollment. Teal level dancers should wear teal leotards, pink tights, and cover-up skirts.

INTERMEDIATE BALLET

Intermediate Ballet has been split into two groups this year. Intermediate Ballet I and Intermediate Ballet II.

INTERMEDIATE BALLET I

Intermediate Ballet I is for dancers in Grade 3-7 by invitation. This class is designed for dancers wishing to further ballet foundations and will focus primarily on refining technique. We recommend dancers in Intermediate I take an additional ballet class during the week:

- Dancers in Grade 3-4—Combo Level Class by grade
- Dancers in Grade 5 + Open Ballet Technique on Tuesday @ 3:45
- Dancers in Intermediate I should also take Pre-Pointe on Monday @ 7:00 pm.

INTERMEDIATE BALLET II

Intermediate Ballet II is for dancers in Grade 7+, by invitation or approval. This class is designed for dancers wishing to further ballet foundations. Dancers in Intermediate II should also take an additional ballet class during the week:

- Open Ballet Technique Tuesday @ 3:45
- Pre-Pointe—Monday @ 7:00 pm—OR—Pointe I—Tuesday @ 4:45

NEW MODERN CLASS: MODERN I

• A beginner MODERN I class will be offered on Monday @ 6:00-6:45 pm. This class is designed for Dancers in Intermediate Ballet (I or II) who have not yet taken Modern.

COMBO 3/4 + TAP — THURSDAYS @ 1:30-3:00 pm

This class is recommended for 3rd-4th grade dancers who were part of Combo 2/3 at the same time in 2022 -2023. This class has been extended to provide extra time for ballet barre.

PINK LEVEL CLASSES

3 YEAR OLD BALLET, PRE-K 4 BALLET, KINDER-BRIDGE BALLET — These classes will focus on basic ballet and jazz dance technique, rhythms, introducing French terminology and movement quality. Emphasis is on basic overall body alignment and placement of the body through praise and worship music specific to age level. **Dancers are required to wear pink leotard, pink tights, and pink ballet shoes.**

BLACK/COMBO LEVEL CLASSES

COMBINATION LEVEL CLASSES (COMBO 1/2, COMBO 2/3, COMBO 3/4, OR GRADES 4-6) — Classes are based on the dancer's current grade. Combo classes will focus on basic ballet, tap, and/or jazz technique, rhythms, terminology and movement quality, while utilizing Contemporary Christian, popular, and classical music. Emphasis is on basic overall body alignment and placement of the body through praise and worship music specific to age level. Dancers in all Combo Levels are required to wear black leotard, pink ballet tights, pink ballet shoe. Dancers may bring cover up for warmth. Combo Tap classes will also require black Mary Jane-style tap shoes.

FIRST STEPS TO BROADWAY I & II — An introduction to Musical Theatre choreography in an age-appropriate environment. This class introduces the young performer to Broadway style jazz and tap techniques. These classes are perfect for our Musical Theatre students and any young actresses or actors. Level I will be open to dancers in Grades 1-3; Level II will be open to dancers in Grades 4-6. Dancers are required to wear black leotard (girls), jazz pants or jazz shorts with tan tights, tan tap shoes and tan jazz shoes. Boys should wear a black t-shirt and black shorts or joggers in which they can move freely; tan or black jazz shoes.

BROADWAY BOYS—An introduction to Musical Theatre choreography in an age-appropriate environment. This class introduces the male performer to Broadway style jazz and tap techniques. This class is perfect for boys interested in Musical Theatre, but lacking in dance training. Boys should wear a black t-shirt and black shorts or joggers in which he can move freely; tan or black jazz shoes.

HIP HOP I – This dynamic, high-energy class teaches young students basic vocabulary and style of hip-hop movement and technique. Dancers develop rhythm, coordination, and self-expression while developing muscular strength, flexibility, and proper isolations of the body. This class enables students to have more freedom of self-expression while utilizing the latest popular Christian Hip Hop and Pop artists. Students may wear their own style of leotard, t-shirt, legging or pant that one can dance and stretch in. Students are not allowed to wear shorts without leggings or anything that shows the midsection of the body. Hip Hop 1 is open to dancers in Grades 3-5. This is an introductory level class, so no dance experience is required. We suggest that all dancers in Hip Hop enroll in a ballet & jazz technique class.

PURPLE/INTERMEDIATE LEVEL CLASSES

INTERMEDIATE BALLET I & II, OPEN BALLET TECHNIQUE, PRE-POINTE — These classes will focus on more advanced overall body alignment and placement of the body. As the foundation of all dance movement, ballet strengthens dancers' muscular development, cultivates the initial grace of the student, and increases the control of body movement, self-confidence, and self-discipline. Traditional barre, center work, and ballet combinations will be included through praise and worship and Contemporary Christian music specific to student's level of training. Dancers are required to wear a purple leotard, pink ballet tights, and pink soft ballet shoe. For 2023-2024, Intermediate Ballet II on Mondays will be open to dancers in Grade 7+ with at least two years of dance experience. Intermediate Ballet I will be open to dancers in Grade 3+ by invitation. Open Ballet Technique or Intermediate Ballet will be required for SPA Company members, based on grade level. Dancers of any level, beginning in Grade 5, may take Open Ballet Technique.

JAZZ I & II — These dynamic, high-energy classes teach dancers basic vocabulary and style of jazz movement and technique. Dancers develop rhythm, coordination, and self-expression while developing muscular strength, flexibility, and proper isolations of the body. Level I classes are designed for dancers in Grades 3 +, with summer jazz experience; Level II classes are designed for dancers in Grades 6-8, with one or two years of experience. Dancers in Jazz I or II should also be enrolled in a ballet technique class. Dancers are required to wear a purple leotard; tan tights with jazz short or leggings; tan jazz shoes. Placement is by teacher recommendation or approval.

MODERN I & II — These classes focus on new philosophies of movement that are less formal than other types of dance, but still incorporate a strong foundation of technique. Students will continue to develop their dance skills with musical interpretation, sustained extensions, fresh movement opportunities and expressive emotion through praise and worship specific to age level. Modern I & II classes should wear purple leotard, black leggings, and are barefoot. Dancers wishing to enroll in Modern classes should also be enrolled in a ballet technique class, based on ballet level. Faculty must approve of dancer's enrollment given student's prior dance experience and training.

HIP HOP II —This dynamic high-energy class teaches students' vocabulary and style of hip-hop movement. Hip Hop requires dancers to have the strength and stamina to successfully perform moves. Dancers develop rhythm, coordination, and self-expression while developing muscular strength, flexibility, and proper isolations of the body. This class enables students to have more freedom of self-expression while utilizing the latest popular Christian Hip Hop and Pop artists. Students may wear their own style of leotard, t-shirt, legging or pant that one can dance and stretch in. Students are not allowed to wear shorts without leggings or anything that shows the mid-section of the body. We strongly suggest that dancers also take a Ballet/Jazz combo class in addition to this class. Requires prior dance experience. Faculty must approve of dancer's enrollment given dancer's prior dance experience and training.

TEAL LEVEL CLASSES

ADVANCED BALLET - TECHNIQUE, CONDITIONING, POINTE I/II/III — These classes will focus on more advanced overall body alignment and placement of the body. As the foundation of all dance movement, ballet strengthens dancers' muscular development, cultivates the initial grace of the dancer, and increases the control of body movement, self-confidence, and self-discipline. Traditional barre, center work, ballet combinations, Pilates, and conditioning will be included through Contemporary Christian music specific to student's level of training. Class hours will be divided over multiple days. Dancers are required to wear teal leotard, pink ballet tights, and pink soft ballet shoe for technique. To enroll in a pointe class, dancers must first pass a pointe test with Ms. Heather. Pointe shoes are required for pointe classes. Faculty must approve of dancer's enrollment in each level given dancer's prior dance experience and training. Dancers must pass a pointe test before enrolling in Beginning Pointe or Pointe.

JAZZ III with LEAPS & TURNS—For dancers in Grade 8+, with experience. This dynamic, high-energy class teaches dancers the vocabulary and style of jazz movement and technique. Dancers develop rhythm, coordination, and self-expression while developing muscular strength, flexibility, and proper isolations of the body. Dancers in Jazz III should also be enrolled in a ballet technique class. Dancers may wear any leotard color desired; tan tights with jazz short or leggings; tan jazz shoes. Placement in this class is by teacher recommendation or approval.

STEPS TO BROADWAY — This class will focus on the fundamentals of Broadway-style Jazz and Tap. Each month will focus on a specific choreographer and style—think "Fosse" ("Pajama Game," "Fosse"); Robbins ("West Side Story," "Peter Pan"); Jerry Mitchell ("Hairspray"); and Michael Kidd ("Seven Brides for Seven Brothers"). Dancers are required to wear black or teal leotard, jazz pants or jazz shorts with tan tights, tan tap shoes (junior character style), and tan jazz shoes. For dancers with experience, based on teacher approval.

MODERN IIII — This class focuses on new philosophies of movement that are less formalized than other types of dance, but still incorporates a strong foundation of technique. Students will continue to develop their dance skills with musical interpretation, sustained extensions, fresh movement opportunities and expressive emotion through praise and worship specific to age level. Modern classes should wear black or teal leotard (based on class level), black leggings, and are barefoot. Dance socks are recommended. Dancers wishing to enroll in Modern classes should also be enrolled in a ballet technique class, based on ballet level. Faculty must approve of dancer's enrollment given student's prior dance experience and training.

HIP HOP III — This dynamic high-energy class teaches students' vocabulary and style of hip-hop movement. Hip Hop dance requires students to have the strength and stamina to successfully perform moves. Dancers develop rhythm, coordination, and self-expression while developing muscular strength, flexibility,

and proper isolations of the body. This class enables students to have more freedom of self-expression while utilizing the latest popular Christian Hip Hop and Pop artists. Students may wear their own style of leotard, t-shirt, legging or pant that one can dance and stretch in. Students are not allowed to wear shorts without leggings or anything that shows the mid-section of the body. We strongly suggest that dancers also take a Ballet/Jazz combo class in addition to this class. Requires prior dance experience. Faculty must approve of student's enrollment given student's prior dance experience and training. This class is offered as needed.

COMPANY – The SPA COMPANY is a performance group. Dancers will work on specific styles, combining the Contemporary and Lyrical genres. The style uses fluid body movements combined with power and control. It fuses newer philosophies of movement, including modern and contemporary dance, with classical styles, such as ballet and jazz. This creates unique movement that is less formalized than other types of dance, but still incorporates a strong foundation of technique. Students will continue to develop their dance skills with musical interpretation, sustained extensions, fresh movement opportunities and expressive emotion through praise and worship specific to age level. In addition, students will have the opportunity to utilize their gift of dance in church services and ministry opportunities at Second Baptist Church. The Company is divided into multiple levels, based on grade level and experience. Dancers are required to wear a teal leotard, pink ballet tights, pink soft ballet shoe, black jazz Capri or pant for cover-up, tan jazz shoe and/or lyrical shoe.

POLICIES

MISSED LESSON POLICY

It is our expectation that students will attend weekly lessons as scheduled.

Excused Absences include any absence of which the teacher has been notified at least 24 hours in advance.

Unexcused Absences include any missed lessons of which the teacher was not notified at least 24 hours in advance.

If a student is unable to attend a lesson, parents must inform the teacher and a member of the School of Performing Arts staff at least 24 hours in advance to qualify as an excused absence. This should be done through the fastest means possible, whether that is email or text message. Teachers will extend the same courtesy if they cancel a lesson.

Two make-up lessons will be given for each semester, and those will be arranged according to the teacher's schedule. Both make-up lessons should be completed before the beginning of the next semester unless the student has registered for the full year of lessons. Extenuating circumstances may be considered, but must be approved by the individual teacher and the Director of the School of Performing Arts. If teachers are forced to cancel lessons, make-ups will be offered according to the teacher's schedule.

Students will be required to make payment for lessons that:

- 1. They attend.
- 2. Are unexcused.
- 3. Are make-up lessons from an excused absence.

If a teacher is not informed that a student will miss his or her lesson, it will be counted as an <u>unexcused</u> absence and will **NOT** be refunded or rescheduled.

CLASS ABSENCES— DANCE, MUSICAL THEATRE

Due to the nature of the class environment, there will be no make-ups offered for missed classes. If teachers are unable to teach a particular class and are unable to find a substitute for the regular class time, a make-up class will be offered according to the teacher's schedule.

Class absences may affect placement in dance choreography and musical theatre casting.

STUDENT ARRIVAL/DISMISSAL

Parents or guardians are responsible for walking students in Grades 4 and under to individual lessons or classes. A parent or guardian must be present at the lesson or class room to pick up these students at the end of the lesson or class. This is a Second Baptist Church policy. Students in Grades 5 and up are dismissed to meet parents on their own. Students should not be left waiting for parents after lessons or classes.

REFUND POLICY

The \$10 semester registration fee is non-refundable.

Once lessons or classes have begun, initial payments cannot be refunded. In signing up for lessons for the semester, there is a commitment both from the student and the teacher which must be honored. If a student must terminate lessons before the end of a semester, he or she should contact the Director of the School of Performing Arts.

MATERIALS/CURRICULUM

All additional materials expenses are determined by teachers and our administration. We work to keep these expenses to a minimum.

Private Lessons: Students will be expected to provide personal instruments, accessories, and literature as required by their teacher. Teachers will inform students of any particular method books, musical pieces, etc., they will need, and it is the responsibility of the student to purchase these materials in a timely manner. Pianos are available for students to play during their lesson time, but piano students are expected to have an appropriate practice piano or keyboard for individual practice during the week.

Musical Theatre: Students may be required to purchase dance shoes and/or specific costume pieces or performance necessities each semester.

Dance: Dancers will be required to purchase dancewear, spring recital costumes, and accessories.

RECITALS/PERFORMANCES

Each student taking private lessons through the School of Performing Arts will be highly encouraged to perform in the semester recitals and/or showcases, as well as any other arranged performances. These opportunities are designed to be low-pressure, positive environments to learn performance skills and are an invaluable part of the students' study. If you have any questions, please feel free to discuss these with your assigned teacher or with the School of Performing Arts staff.

It is expected that all dance and musical theatre students will participate in end of semester showcases or productions.
